A letter from your Vicar

Aren't we the fortunate ones! Over the last few weeks we have held a Baptism Service in all four churches, with more still to come. As you can see from the Registers this month, we have welcomed seven new Christians into the Parish of Christ the King. Aren't we the fortunate ones!

Baptism is a holy Sacrament of the Church, a means of God's Grace, where new Christians are welcomed into their new Church family. This comes with a responsibility for all Christians, especially those who worship regularly. We are required to voice our support of the newly baptised and we promise to uphold them in their new life in Christ.

I would ask "Is this what we really do at these special and very precious services?" Too often, instead of offering support, I hear grumbles about commitment, behaviour and disruptive noise. I have even been asked to move **all** Baptism services to Sunday afternoons away from **our** usual morning worship. This is far from the Christian attitude I would expect from members of my congregations and please be assured that this will never happen whilst I am the Vicar of Meltham.

I want to see the newly baptised, and their families, welcomed and embraced by all members of our churches, including those who choose to stay away from the Baptism services, so that the words of the Baptism Commission ring true throughout the Parish of Christ the King.

'In baptism God invites you on a life-long journey. Together with **all God's people** you must explore the way of Jesus and grow in friendship with God in love for his people, and in serving others. **With us** you will listen to the word of God and receive the gifts of God.'

We all have a part to play in nurturing and inspiring those at the very beginning of their Christian pilgrimage, perhaps that begins with each of us considering our own journey and calling to mind those who were there for us at the very start. Perhaps it will mean each one of us considering our own behaviour in church - do we talk when we should be quiet, do we join in idle gossip, do we grumble to our neighbour instead of offering our concerns in prayer?

Her name was Lizzie Coyle (now Jones) and she was invited by The Rugby Football League to lead the singing at the Wembley Cup Final in front of 80.000 fans. Lizzie is a music teacher and takes leading parts in musicals as well as doing gigs. To be asked to do Wembley is an accolade in itself, but this was particularly so for Lizzie, as some will recall that about 4 months ago she was left alone to bring up 3 month old twins. Her husband Danny had a heart attack playing rugby for Keighley Cougars and died in the dressing room. She had courage and nerve to do it. Her late husband's photo was on the big screens in the stadium, the crowd were still and before a pretty much worldwide TV audience she did a great performance. After her last life changing and devastating 4 months, how does anyone sing "Abide with Me" and "The National Anthem." in front of such a vast audience? Well, being a true professional, she did it with aplomb. Her sister carried the twins to her at the end and she left to great applause holding them in her arms. The Cup Final will be remembered for many things, but Lizzie's debut at England's National Stadium will be one of them.

The Cat and the Cavity

It was 2 a.m. in the morning and I got a nudge "are you awake?" No answer. A further stronger nudge followed with the same words but in a stronger voice. This time I responded. "Can you hear that cat outside?" I went to the window, no cat visible, so crept back to bed. Then it came again, the meowing, and like the dripping tap you are very still and listen. There it was again, but the noise and now footsteps were actually above us, in the roof space. We were living in a semi detached house in Meltham and a cat was free range in the roof.

After 3 nights we gave up and called in "The Big Game Hunter," the RSPCA who loaned us 2 cat traps, with the parting words "Ring us when you've caught it." Twenty four hours elapsed and then one morning before going to work it was there, like a miniature tiger snarling and clawing trying to get out. The RSPCA couldn't come quick enough. The game hunt was over. Silent nights ensued.



1kg ripe tomatoes, peeled and chopped 750g cooking apples, peeled, cored and chopped 375g light muscovado sugar 250g onions, chopped 250g raisins 1 green pepper, deseeded and chopped 2 tsp salt ½ tsp ground ginger
