A letter from your Clergy

A Happy, New, Peaceful and Prosperous Year to all our readers! 2018, a year of change for our Parish of Christ the King, Meltham. One Vicar has gone and next our Curate, Charlene, is moving into "Bible Belt". Well the New Year 2018, New Year's Eve, I don't mean when we make New Year's resolutions, these only get broken don't they?! But New Year's Eve is a great day to think about the year ahead and the resolutions you might chose to make. 

Moist Date Loaf (Irene's well sought after recipe!)

Ingredients:

4 Weetabix

1 cup of chopped dates / prunes

1 cup of sugar

4 tbl spn butter (60g)

1 teasp bicarbonate of soda

1 egg

1 cup of self raising flour

1 and a half teasp baking powder

A pinch of salt

1 cup of boiling water

Half a cup of chopped walnut and pecan nuts

(if you don't have American cups measure, just use the same cup for all ingredients)

Method:

1. Preheat oven at 160 degrees

2. Loaf tin lined

3. Large bowl into which you crumble the Weetabix

4. Add sugar, chopped dates / prunes, butter and bicarb

5. Pour a cup of boiling water in and leave to soften for 5 mins

6. Add SR flour, egg and mix together well. The batter will be thick

7. Add chopped nuts

8. Pour into loaf tin and bake for 45 mins or until done



9. Leave to cool in tin



HELME LADIES

For the past 12 months or so, my husband Mel has been putting together a Powerpoint Presentation called (appropriately enough) 'Mel's Orkney Story', which he has been wanting to do for some time and because his Orkney slide show was 25 years outdated. He agreed to a first showing to our group on November 7th and it went down well. The story begins with our unplanned sojourn across the Pentland Firth in 1966 with our bikes and camping equipment, how we both fell in love with these islands and have just visited them again in 2017 our 12th time. Testimony Time...

[®] For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.' Jeremiah 29:11 NIV

I have been a Christian for many years, and so often we give God credit as Amelia did in last months issue for how he intervenes, changes us and takes us from a dark or unknowing place to being in a knowing relationship with him.

However, God's grace and guidance does not stop there, as I think this very abridged story of how we moved to Meltham shows.

As a family, Debbie and I were both "Sussex born and bred" we had however for many years wondered about moving out of Sussex. Why, for many reasons, not least that we are the types of people that have restless feet. Also in part living in Sussex is a high cost area and we had often thought about moving to an area where the cost of living was not so high. In addition for us as rural folk the housing development in Sussex was massive, the small town we lived in literally quadrupled in size from little over 10,000 to 40,000 in twenty years, and this is not an isolated case.

We had over the years considered at different times that there were 3 areas in the country that we would like to move to, if we ever did move out of Sussex. The West Country, East Anglia, and Yorkshire. In 2010 I had reached a stage in my career as a specialist nurse, where I am one of only about 150 at that time in the country, I also felt ready for one last promotion to a more senior role. However, with this level of speciality Career opportunities are few and far between. In addition, at that time my job in Sussex was looking very much at risk, redundancy, and having to leave the speciality I loved and take another nursing role was looking a real possibility.

I was not really looking for another job. However one night I was "surfing the net" and felt inspired to have a look at the NHS jobs website, there was a job in Huddersfield, Yorkshire advertised that was not only my speciality, but also the promotion and challenge I felt ready for.

Well getting the job was the easy part. Moving a family and my elderly and increasingly dependant mother, to the other end of the country, plus achieving this without too much disruption to our daughters schooling, (she was just about to start her GCSE's) needed a lot more planning and faith. Space does not permit me to fill in all the detail and every bit of God's guidance and provision, if I did it would fill a book. However, suffice to say having taken the job at one point it looked like I would be travelling back and forwards to Yorkshire for 3 years.

Then the following February we came to the decision and some of the obstacles dropped out of the way, that if we could organise the move so that our daughter could start at her new school in September at the start of her GCSE course we could do it.

One long weekend in April instead of me travelling to Sussex, my wife and daughter travelled up. To be introduced to her new school (Royds Hall), we chose one near were I worked so that we could live anywhere, and also to look at houses to rent. I had lined up 5 that were suitable all over Huddersfield and district, one in Meltham.

By the Sunday night we were sitting in a restaurant debating the various attributes of the various houses, and our daughter said, "its the one in Meltham isn't it? Because we are already talking about it as though it is ours". We thought 'Yep she's right'. The next working day I put down the deposit.

A few weeks later my wife was bringing my mum up to look for a place for her to rent. Me Mr. Super confident, did not worry about this bit. How hard can it be to find a suitable flat or bungalow for one elderly person to rent for a few months? Well having looked in my spare time for 2 weeks, 2 hours before I was due to meet them off the train at Mirfield, I had 3, non of which was really suitable. In desperation I went into our village financial advisor and said don't suppose you know of anywhere do you? " no sorry". I had been home 5 minutes and when the phone rung. "Were you the guy who was asking just now about a place to rent? Well I have had an idea, one of my customers has a bungalow they may be interested in renting out, let me make a phone call". It was literally just up the road from us and perfect. Sorted!!

We now just had 2 houses in Sussex to sell and the need to find a 4 bedroom house with a Granny annexe somewhere in Kirklees! And there aren't many of those about, at a time when property was not selling.


Both our houses in Sussex sold within 6 months and 2 weeks of each other. We then spent an entire weekend, looking around Kirklees for a suitable house and by the Sunday night we said to each other, God must be having laugh at our expense, here we are driving around looking at houses, and He is saying what are you doing? I have shown you the perfect house just up the road from you and opposite your mum's bungalow and you are still looking!!. Okay God we get it!

Over the time we have been here there have been many challenges and times when we have wondered did we do the right thing moving to Yorkshire? At those times we have been able to go back to God's amazing provision and know we are in the right place, and yes Meltham now feels very much like home.

Chalking the Door: An Epiphany House Blessing 2018

The wider Church has a custom of blessing homes on the FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY: JANUARY 6TH

to ask God's blessing on our homes and those who live or visit them.

It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrows.

A traditional way of doing this is to use chalk blessed during our Epiphany liturgy and write above the doorway to the house, 20 + C + M + B + 18. The letters C, M, B have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the three Magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar.

They also abbreviate the Latin words *Christus Mansionem Benedicat* 'May Christ bless this house'.

The + signs represent the cross and 2018 is the year.

Wondering how we could entertain our seven and ten year old grandchildren on a


