Testimony Time...

I became a Christian 37 years ago. I wasn't planning it, it just happened and I didn't know what hit me.

I attended a youth group meeting at the Huddersfield Elim Penticostal Church whilst chaperoning my sister, who was interested in dating one of the boys there. However, God had other ideas and both my sister and I gave our lives to Christ during the worship instead.

From that day to this ,my life has been a journey of discovery and finding Jesus in almost everything I do has become a daily challenge. My journey has been full of ups and downs, being a Christian is not plane sailing! Responding to the call of Christ takes you to places you never expect.

Some time later I found myself responding to a sermon in church with a life changing trip to the inner city squatter camps of Manila, in the Philippines. When I visited Tim and Kate there I was so impressed by the way that they had responded to God's call in their lives that I came back and set up Jigsaw Kids Ministries charity to raise funds to help them.

During this time of growth in faith I was challenged by a member of the St James congregation to return to study and become a student of pastoral ministry. Four years later I graduated with a foundation degree in theology and a Bishops certificate in pastoral ministry. I made the mistake of asking God 'what next?' Again, he answered and I got the opportunity to put my learning into practice.

Five years ago I began working for the Diocese as PA to the Archdeacon of Halifax and now use both my theology and pastoral ministry on a daily basis. Self reflection is something that is paramount on my journey with Christ and I have learnt that if I don't take time out to be still and regain focus, I loose sight of the path. I take my spiritual health seriously, attending quiet days, following daily bible notes and attending bible study at house and lent groups.



My challenge to you is face your fear! Ask God to show you what you can do for him today, you won't be disappointed in his answer, just try it!





POLLUTION: IT USED TO BE CHIMNEYS, NOW IT'S VEHICLES

It was the London smog of 1952 that set it all off. Hundreds of people died or were affected by poor air quality in the capital and elsewhere, but London grabbed the headlines. The smog caused by fog and emissions, mainly from coal fires set up a blanket of pollutants that persisted for days. It was perhaps fortuitous that it was London, as it caused parliament to consider introducing a remedy. The solution, as you might expect; a report, The Beaver Report into causes, effects and remedies and this culminated in the Clean Air Act 1956. This introduced Smoke Control Areas (SCA) (commonly referred to as Smokeless Zones) It authorised local authorities to give grants of 70% or more to owners or occupiers to convert their coal fires so as to burn smokeless fuel. Such products as Coalite or Rexco come to mind. The alternative which most people favoured was to have gas or electric fires. Closed stoves and log fires were also permitted. Health Departments in industrial areas set about the task with zeal, but this was not without difficulties. In some of these areas, coal was king whether it was the industrial or domestic situation. On the former, industry set about ridding their factories of coal guzzling Lancashire or similar boilers in favour of gas or oil. In the case of houses, because of vehement opposition, some authorities delayed making areas for a number of years. The ideas were new, coal industry would be badly affected and as a last ditch gamble, it's in London not here. The new approach gradually took hold. This was 60 years ago. The air is now much cleaner, or is it? The pea soup fogs are a thing of the past, and long gone is the mass of industrial and domestic chimneys that were an essential part of the landscape. A science friend of mine told me that a consequence of this absence of coal/smoke pollution was that moss and lichen readily invade stonework and many of our grit stone walls are green.

Pollution is still a talking point and remedies are being promoted. This time round it is the internal combustion engine. All the thousands of vehicles on the roads add up to traffic pollution. Restrictions on traffic flow in towns is being considered as legal pollution levels are breached. The once favoured diesel car is now seen as a culprit. Restricting polluting vehicles from cities is also an option and reducing the numbers entering towns by improved public transport is favoured. More and more do we see people using a mask over their mouths. This is very common in Far East Countries.

So pollution never goes away. We found an acceptable way to control it 60 years ago and now we will have to find a solution to the current air pollution debate. Will grants be available?

Climate change, pollution, natural disasters - they are all in the mix.
