A Letter from your Clergy

As I sit to write this letter we are still in March and surrounded by beautiful glowing white snow, lit up from the rays of sunshine coming across the landscape and in through the windows. It is quiet, apart from the squawking and distant singing of birds. As you read this it will be April, and I can hear the words in all our churches and across the world proclaiming with joy:

Alleluia. Christ is risen.

All: He is risen indeed. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

The victory over death is won in the glorious resurrection of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ! Happy Easter!

On a number of occasions during Lent we found Jesus trying to break through His disciples' denial and misunderstanding about His death, in order to prepare them (and us) for the event and what it would mean.

In John 12.20-33, Jesus turns to nature for a metaphor to try to help them understand, and speaks of 'a single grain'. If it is put into the ground, it will break down, as if dead. From that death, life grows and we see a plant with many grains that can be used for food. Jesus is saying that His life may have a small effect while He is alive but from His death will come new life - enough for the entire world. That is why He will not try to avoid his death. He knows that true life, for Him and for those who come after Him, only comes on the other side of death—which is now so gloriously demonstrated and fulfilled in His triumphant resurrection. Jesus turned the cross 'of crucifixion' into one 'of victory and abundant life'.

Jesus tells those present (and us) that those who are anxious to save their temporal or earthly life, comfort and security, shall lose eternal or heavenly existence. But those who are willing to risk, or lose, their comfort and life here, for Christ's sake, shall find life everlasting (v25). He then goes on to say:

"Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour" (v26)

So what does all this mean for us today? Jesus was not just speaking of Himself but also about all His followers (including you and me) needing to face up to the inevitability of death. This isn't easy. It's hard to face up to death, both our own and that of those we love. We mostly want to take the road of avoidance, to forget about death until we can no longer ignore it, to cling on to youth and beauty and hope that cures will be found for

everything that might harm us. Being afraid of death, trying to delay it at all costs and trying to defeat the signs of ageing are all still with us today. The obsession with preserving our lives as they are prevents us from attending to the kind of life that really matters, i.e. a life that is full and generous, truthful and fruitful.

Jesus' message is that death leads to real life, in which we know our limitations and can be honest about them, and not be afraid to take risks and speak out for love and truth. The result is of course worth it, as it brings eternal, heavenly life for us all who follow Him – and what's more, it begins right now!

The way of faith is not one of fear, pride, defensiveness and worry but (Matthew 6.25 -34; Luke 12.22-34) requires us to try to follow Christ's example of righteousness and courage, guided by the Holy Spirit and trusting in God - for Jesus 'is the way, the truth and the life' (John 14:6).

To conclude, let us turn to Richard Holloway (1997) who, using metaphors of music and dancing, insists that:


"The very last word should be about joy and exhilaration, about dancing on the edge ... go with the music right to the edge, and over it if necessary because we follow one (*Jesus Christ of Nazareth*) who told us not to be afraid, since he was already away ahead of us."



One of the highlights from our February programme is to journey over to Marsden's Parochial Hall and see the pantomime by the almost all-male cast The Avalanche Dodgers. The title of this years panto was Alice in Blunderland, again written by Marsden's Peter Armitage MBE. Clearly this is a twist on Lewis Carrol's, Alice in Wonderland but with a difference. Rumour has it that Lewis Carrol was high on Opium when he wrote Alice in Wonderland and we are led to wonder whether Peter Armitage was well under the affluence of incohol on his recent Spanish holiday where he wrote 'Blunderland'. It is nevertheless a work of true genius! BISHOP TONY ROBINSON'S SERMON- CHARLENE'S LICENSING SERVICE,13TH FEBRUARY

In our Gospel today we hear.....beginning to sink Peter cried out, "Lord, save me.""

If he had prayed a longer prayer, he would have been twenty-nine feet under water before he would have gotten to his request. Peter got right down to business, and you and I need to pray like that.

'Jesus immediately reached out his hand and took hold of him!'

We have to remember that in our dark moments because this incident happened during the fourth watch of the night, between 3 AM and 6 AM.

Factories with night shifts have higher rates of accidents in these early hours. We don't think as clearly in these early hours. These are hours of testing or trial.

A lesson for us is that God will come and help us but not when we want him to come. He comes to us in his time. It might be during the fourth watch.

The message is not to let our experiences of life overwhelm our experiences of faith.

Peter could walk on water when he looked at Jesus— Our energy is the fundamental currency of high performance. Every thought, feeling, and action has an energy consequence. Some say that managing energy, not time, is the key to high performance.

When walking on water, don't look down at your feet because this represents yourself without God in our life, and your past limitations.

Someone said, "Life isn't about waiting for the storm to pass. It's about learning how to dance in rain."

Peter got out of the boat. If you want to walk on water, you got to get out of the boat. Your boat could be your house, your car, your job, your relationships—do something for God with them that you have not done before.

Jesus doesn't censure feelings. He did not say, "Do not be afraid, it is I". He said, "Take heart, it is I, do not be afraid". We add to our fear by attempting to maintain an appearance of strength and then worrying that how we really feel will be found out. Or, we may simply retreat in our own world. When we stop denying our fear or fighting it, we can accept it. We no longer fear our fear. Trouble is a tunnel which we pass through and not a brick wall against which we must break our head.

We learn that fear can be replaced with faith. We can begin to let down our guard and then realize that we had only the illusion of control.

We learn to let go of our fear, and when we do, God gives us the strength needed to meet the situation at hand.

Fear and discouragement can make the greatest person ineffective. It can choke all growth. It brings progress to a standstill. It can render a Christian, a leadership, a congregation useless more easily than anything. For when we are discouraged we don't pray like we should; we don't read our Bibles as we should; we don't step out in faith; we don't trust God. In discouragement we stumble back into old sins and destructive habits.

This is why we are told so many times in the New Testament to encourage one another. In our reading tonight: Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing.

It's not just on Sundays we need encouragement. It could be any day, and every day we need to be prepared to encourage one another. The Letter to the Hebrews reminds us that one of the core purposes of the church, especially the church meeting together is mutual encouragement, "Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

So let me issue the challenge in the same way that Paul does: "encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing." I like to imagine a church where everyone there is your greatest supporter. They all believe you can do it. They're all ready to help you make it happen. They're all there to help you back up when you stumble. And they're all thrilled when you do succeed. That's the kind of church we are called to be.

The New Testament word for encourage is such a beautiful picture in itself. The Greek word the Bible uses means to "come alongside of, to stand with." You encourage someone when you come alongside someone and help carry the load, you help them keep going. You guide them in which way to go.

Jesus uses this very same word in the gospel of John to describe the Holy Spirit. When Jesus called the Spirit the Comforter, He is saying that the Holy Spirit is the one who comes alongside us, and stands with us, and helps us to move on. That's what encouragement does. My prayer is that together great things will happen and more people will come to know and join this Christian community.


