





MELTHAM MUSTARD SEED the charity was set up by

Meltham Churches Together to help raise and educate orphans in Kyema (Uganda). Children are placed with foster parents, whilst the charity funds their welfare, medical and educational needs.

Since 1996, 37 young adults have progressed through Mustard Seed. They have all been cared for in a monitored, stable, foster environment and received a good education. Some have achieved a degree, diploma or higher education certificate. A few are still seeking employment. Godfrey continues to work within the Ugandan Government (actually working with the Presidents wife). And there are also accountants, teachers, social workers, educational assistants, environment officers, a nurse, tailors, tax officers, plumbers, electricians, hotel and catering managers, and some working in environment and forestry management.

Currently there are 37 children in the project at various levels of support and education.

Since 1996 MMS has given £172,000 to KMS.

Some employed ex KMS members are now contributing to KMS to fund further new orphans.

Testimony Time...

Until very recently I have always thought my testimony was a bit boring - born into a faithful family, completely 'churched' as a child, encouraged through my love of sacred music of all types, and enough of it stuck to keep me going into my adult life. Thank God, but no flashes of light or defining moments.

But I've thought again recently. This year I have studied the philosophy of religion (all religions). Why? I find that as I get older, worship more, pray more, sin more, forgive more, that I have more and more unanswered questions. At first I thought that to question was a sin in itself - isn't faith belief without evidence? - but my thirst to know more, think more, wouldn't go away. I buried it for a while (other than lots of reading of great books such as Your God is too Small (J B Philiips) and When I pray what does God do? (David Wilkinson) and I was encouraged by my great friends Lisa and Penny who introduced me to the London Institute of Contemporary Christianity and their mission for us to be 'Monday to Saturday' christians - Whole Life - not just Sundays or when we're in need. If you're online I encourage you to join their daily prayer journeys - great stuff www.licc.org.uk Yet, I still had the itch to know more.

I talked to one of the ministers in the Parish where I now live. She is a bit of an intellectual geek by her own admission. She challenged me why I thought that God was all powerful, yet wasn't the God of intellect, of science, or everything. That was all I needed. As I study those philosophers who claim there is a God and those who claim there isn't. As I look hard at all arguments, I have been emboldened in the beliefs I've held since childhood and stretched to trust God more and more.

God speaks to us all in different ways if we persevere to be in relationship with him. Alleluia!

HELME LADIES

Last year some five mature ladies, including our member Jean Danson, went on a trip to Palestine together. This was no package tour with a fixed itinerary showing all the nice places. Instead the ladies experienced Palestine in the raw. A land where the Palestinians (Arabs) and the Israelis (Jews) are still at war with each other and have been for more than a century.

In 1918 the Balfour agreement was to establish a homeland for the Jews in Palestine. Not since biblical times have the Jews had their own homeland. The plan was for the Jews and Arabs to share the lands and live happily together in a country split equally with their own identity – Palestine and Israel. As we all know the Arabs resisted resulting in the Jews forcing their way in. Today Israel is the totally dominant country and Palestine has been throttled by wars and political decisions until it is only a very small percentage of these extensive lands. Despite countless attempts by the international communities to try and broker a peace deal and come to some agreement there has been no lasting success and Palestine is now a very oppressed country with people constantly living in fear.

It was into this country that our five intrepid travellers entered and we learned of their experiences as told by our speaker, Vicki Minton, at the meeting in Helme Church on Tuesday 10th April.


Arriving at Tel Aviv airport the ladies did an extensive tour of the region using public transport, taxis and their two feet, visiting Jerusalem, Jericho, Bethlehem, The Dead Sea, Hebron, Ramallah and Nablus. They met some wonderful people as well as those almost too frightened to speak. They were treated like royalty by some and scum by others. They saw some wonderful sights and at the same time saw filth and rubbish on the streets. They saw the effects of the oppression in large walls dividing up territory and Palestinian homes being bulldozed to make way for Israeli development. There was so much to take in and we had to feel sorry for normal citizens, who would like a stable life as was envisaged in the Balfour plan, but are faced with a constant nightmare existence. Our speaker believes that it is only a matter of time before the land is wholly Israel and Palestine will cease to exist.

We in Helme Ladies marvelled at the courage of these fearless five, undertaking this adventure and the images they brought back. It certainly was not for the faint hearted but we thoroughly enjoyed sharing their experiences.

Our meeting at Helme Church on 24th April was a Cheese & Wine Evening. Naturally there was a large variety of cheeses, biscuits, hot cross buns, grapes, celery and tomatoes. We all tucked in to the spread with enthusiasm as well as enjoying the various wines, tea or coffee. As usual there was a lot to talk about and during the evening we discussed some of our future plans. These include a theatre evening at the Lawrence Batley Theatre to see Joseph and His Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat on 12th September and possibly a 2 or 3 day coach trip to Thursford in Norfolk to see the Christmas Spectacular stage show. Our Christmas Lunch was discussed and this will be held at Meltham Golf Club on Monday 17th December. It did seem strange though to be discussing events at the other end of the year when we are struggling to get through the current long winter near the end of April, but we have to plan well ahead.






