A Letter from your Vicar

I should begin by saying hello to everyone in the Parish of Meltham Christ the King, from myself and all of my family. I would also like to thank you all for the warm welcome that we have received. This welcome has taken a number of different forms, including cards and gifts from within the Churches, but also has come from the wider community including help in finding our way around (particularly the nice lady in the chip shop who helped us to find a hardware store when our tap would not turn off).

We are looking forward to building our families life here over the coming years and have received the news, just a few days ago, that our two older children (Isaac and Rebekah) have been given a place at Meltham C of E school. This has pleased my wife (Fiona) as she hopes to be able to walk them to school each day rather than needing to put our youngest (Jack, just 8 weeks old) in and out of his car seat which can be a more complex procedure than someone might imagine.

I guess some of you may be wondering what it was that made us want to come and join you here in Meltham.

Firstly, having spent around 20 years working in agriculture before I was ordained I think that the Church presumed that I would want to go somewhere rural. However, I grew up in Normanton, a town near to Wakefield that is just a little bigger than Meltham, which like Meltham has an industrial heritage. This means that my background in both life and Church is best described as rural'ish and so a rural'ish setting like Meltham feels the kind of place that we are likely to meet people that we will have plenty in common with.

Secondly, four Churches. I suppose that the difficulties of being the Vicar of four Churches are obvious enough but the more I considered the four Churches of Meltham the less I thought about the possible problems and more the opportunities and the potential began to excite me. I found myself being drawn to the way that each Church seems to value their heritage/unique traditions, but be looking towards the future as they work together to grow God's kingdom and serve the community.

I am very much looking forward to working with people from all four of these Churches and across the wider community as we try to understand and follow God's plan together.

Testimony Time...

As a believer, one of the things that I have wrestled with most is truly believing and trusting that our God is the God of the impossible. Who makes all situations work together for His good and perfect will, however as many people say, hindsight is a wonderful thing. Looking back on my life there a so many times where God has made a situation, that upon first look or in the moment, you could say that there was no way the Lord would be working through that, but it's only upon reflection that you can clearly see His hand in it.

I was born into a seemingly happy and standard Christian home with strong Christian heritage, however at age 9 my parents divorced, my Dad had an affair, fell off the church radar and later remarried. My mum, my younger sister and I kept going to church and maintained a strong front, however behind the scenes it was a wrestle to get me to go to church and as soon as I was old enough, I stopped and spiralled into a rebellious teenager who wasn't interested in the God who allowed her family to fall apart.

Fast forward a few years and when I was 17 I got invited to a local church youth group where I made friends with people who wanted the best for me and made me question where I was getting my satisfaction from. At this point I was in a relationship that was far to serious and was the backbone to a lot of the 'friendships' that I had, when this relationship inevitably came to a messy ending, it was to the friends I'd made at the youth group that I looked to and I threw myself into church life. Slowly the hurts that I'd been carrying and the hole that I'd had in my heart from my parents divorce began to heal.

A few months later I made the decision to get baptised, an event which my mum, younger sister, dad and his new wife all came along to, this sparked a mini revival in my family. From the day of my baptism it caused my mum and sister to get plugged into a healthy church where they made true Christian friendships, my Dad recommitted his life to the Lord and his wife also gave her life to Christ. After they did this his wife fell pregnant, something which they'd been told by medical professionals after years of trying would be impossible. Relationships between everyone in my family were healed and there was so much forgiveness and restoration, in ways I would never imagine.

I am now 19 and working for the local church and for His glory, advancing His Kingdom and blessing the church to give back to the God of miracles, for everything that He has done for me and my family, and everything that I went through has enabled me to give wisdom and insight to young people in the same situation. If someone had told me this is the position me and my family would be in 3 or 4 years ago I would have never believed them.






