A Letter from your Vicar

At my installation service some of you may remember that Canon James introduced me by saying that there are three things that he had learnt from working with me, and that you should expect to learn from me, over the coming years.

One of these was that I had taught him a lot about pigs. I was amused recently to discover that some people found this rather odd because not everybody was aware that I used to be a farmer. Understandably confusing.

The other two are the importance of prayer and the need to tell people about Jesus.

These two things are not the new vicar's bright new ideas. They are quite simply the great commission to which all Christians are called in the Gospel. We are told by Jesus to wait for the Holy Spirit to come, not to try and do things in our own strength but to do things in God's strength, put simply we need to pray. The great work that we are told that we must do in God's strength is that we are to be witnesses to the good news, again put very simply, we must tell people about Jesus.

Of course, the problem is that we very often don't know where to start, after all the bible is a big book and, even if you have read it all it is problematic to decide which bit to begin with. But being a witness really is just telling people about what you yourself have seen and experienced.

For some time now there has been a testimony page in this magazine. Many of you may have read books or heard speakers at large events that give an account of some amazing testimonies. While these have their place they unfortunately can make us think that our own experiences of God working in our lives are simply not very interesting. However, for many people the truth is that God being active in the lives of ordinary people like you and I will resonate more readily than many of these stories.

I believe that we need to tell each other about how our God is active in our lives both to encourage one another and to be affective witnesses to the world. Therefore, please read this month's testimony and, think carefully about whether you may have something that you could offer for the future.

Testimony Time...

God speaks to us in many ways. For example, through: His Holy Spirit; the written word and Holy Bible; dreams; the things we see and hear; the people we know and meet; various objects; music; time and places; everyday experiences; and what I call 'not coincidences' but 'God -incidences'. As our dear Jim Dearden always said:

"He is the God of the minutest detail." (He takes care of everything.)

God has given me so much to write about here that I didn't really know where to start. For over the years I have come to realise the truth of His presence being always with me (us), even when I didn't know it, as given in Psalm 139:

¹³ For it was you *(God)* who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb. . . ¹⁶ Your eyes beheld my unformed substance. In your book were written all the days that were formed for me, when none of them as yet existed.

Last week, David came up to talk to me at coffee time after the service in church and as we stood there by the serving counter, "All Things Bright and Beautiful" started to be played as background music. David stopped and listened – incredulous! He then told me that he didn't know why but he'd been singing that very song at home that morning before leaving for church. He didn't know why he was singing it and there it was ... being played in church after the service. (I got the impression that it was a double whammy for him, i.e. he didn't know why he was singing a hymn at home at all <u>and</u> why that one in particular! It clearly excited and amazed him.)

I then told him how a similar thing once happened to me. We were on our holiday in Northumberland some years ago and the thought of going to church crossed my mind. (*I didn't used to go to church whilst on family holidays in those days.*) To my surprise, at that very moment, my wife Jacqui said, "Why don't you go to church this morning?" (*or words to that effect*). She then told me where she'd seen a local church and gave directions.

It was a lovely sunny day and as I started walking to church, I found myself singing, "At the name of Jesus, every knee shall bow ...". Like David, I didn't know why. This was very unusual for me.

I happily turned the corner, found the church and walked in. It was very dark and bare in the church and quite cool, especially compared to the sunshine outside. When the priest appeared, he looked like he was wearing sack-cloth. He didn't seem very happy and on reflection, he sort of mirrored the appearance of the church.

Then the music started, and everyone stood up – not that there were many of us, it was a small church and not full. But guess what? Of course, you've guessed it but I had forgotten all about it – and there it was – that happy, jaunty hymn, "At the Name of Jesus" springing into life from the organ somewhere at the front.

Then I knew why I had been singing that song on my way to church just minutes earlier. This may not be one of the most astonishing testimonies you've ever heard but for me it was very exciting and encouraging. As I left church after the service, that same song returned to my mind, so much so that at one point I found myself with one foot on the kerb and the other in the gutter, sort of 'Singing in the Rain' style hopping up the road, despite the sunshine and not a rain cloud in sight! realised that I must have looked very odd – but hey, who cares, I was very happy!

When I got home I felt compelled to write to the priest, to tell him what had happened that morning. (I didn't really feel that I had the chance to do this on the way out of church and there were no refreshments after the service.) I hoped that my letter might excite and encourage him too. I don't know if it did or not - but I hope that it did some good and no harm.

Before David and I had finished speaking about these things last week, John Dracup (our new vicar) came to join us and said that 'we really needed small, everyday God-incidences like these that people can relate to in their lives, for our testimony page'.

So there it was, another answered prayer. I didn't know what to write about for this page but God took care of it ... our wonderful 'God of the minutest detail', who loves us and watches over us.
