Testimony Time...

When I first felt that I was being called to ordination I had many promptings by God over quite a long period, although to begin with I did not know that this is what they were. It started with an Ordination Prayer Card, bought for a friend. When the time came to give it to her, I simply could not find it. After she was ordained and had moved away, I found the card – but far too late. From time to time after that, it kept reappearing and it was quite a while before it suddenly realised that it might actually be meant for me!

When I told our vicar about my 'feeling called to ordination', he told me to take it seriously and gave me the phone number of the Diocesan Director of Ordination (DDO). I wrote it down on a piece of paper and popped it in my pocket. I was always writing down numbers on scraps of paper and then losing them – but not this time. This piece of paper kept re-appearing! I didn't want to ring it. There was a reluctance, a nervousness – but it would not go away until I'd made that call and booked an appointment. It took me some time but there, it was done and I could relax!

A few weeks later there was a phone call and my wife Jacqui said, "Dennis, there is a John Bishop on the phone for you." I was intrigued because I didn't know a John Bishop! We laughed afterwards, as it turned out to be Bishop John, calling to say that the DDO was away and she would re-arrange our appointment on her return in a couple of weeks' time.

When she didn't ring back, my resistance to ring her returned. But once more this would not go away until I'd made the call and re-scheduled the meeting. When we met, I told the DDO about the different promptings I'd had, that I believed were from God; and she discerned that I was 'immature in the faith' – which was probably correct. Nevertheless, I later felt it rather curious when meeting a number of 'mature' Christians who had experienced such 'God-incidences' (and those who had not) but wished for them in their lives now! Why was God now so silent?

Regarding my call to ordination, I can remember asking God one last time for a sign that it really was his will for me – although He'd answered several times before. It was at a Parish Communion in St Mary's Church many years ago – and I had arrived late! The church was full but there were 2 spaces at the back for me to quietly slip into. I moved on past both seats, with the flickering thought that someone else may need them. Walking on I found a single space off the nave, next to Jim and Mary Dearden. I immediately bowed my head and silently made that prayed to God. I was still on my knees when everyone rose for the first hymn – but I felt okay about that too. I was soon joining in and I forgot all about my prayer.

After the service, I moved out to allow Jim and Mary to exit ahead of me. At this, someone from the pew opposite came up to Jim and said, "Sorry, for my child coming out into the nave in the middle of the Communion." Jim then replied, "Oh, that's okay. It reminds me of my son who grabbed my hand and came down the nave with me towards the Bishop at my Ordination in 1967." As Jim said this, with his back-turned there, right in front of me, I immediately remembered my prayer – and the hairs on my neck started to tingle. I knew Jim was simply responding to this person cheerfully; but I also felt excited, warm and calm in the knowledge that at the same time, through Jim's words, God was speaking to me.

God helped me, as an immature Christian, in such ways during my journey towards ordination; but when I struggled with the question of choosing full or part-time ministry, He was strangely silent. I remember my application for ordination being tested by Bishop Stephen. The first question he asked me was why I was not applying for full-time ministry. Of all the questions to choose, it was the one I wasn't sure about myself! By the time the Bishop had finished exploring this question, he was unsure too and concluded that we should, 'settle on leaving things as they were', i.e. part-time.

Looking back, I can now see that that things probably turned out for the best and were blessed by God. No one knows why God is sometimes silent but it doesn't mean He is no longer working (Zechariah 4:6). Maybe He gives us much feeding and support during our immaturity – like any parent to a child – but then having prepared us, he gives us the chance to stand on our own faith. This does not mean we 'stand alone', for He is always with us, whether noisily or quietly. In fact, aren't we told in Scripture that He is with us in many ways, not just in the dramatic storms of life but also in the 'still small voice of calm' or a 'whisper' (1 Kings 19:11-13). No one knows the totality of God. But we (you and I) may have faith that He is beside us – inside-out and outside-in – loving and protecting us always.







It was wonderful to see and hear approximately 400 people attend and remember those who gave their lives for our today.

We pray for the soldiers who are still fighting today, and pray protection and peace overt them.



UNITED REMEMBRANCE DAY SERVICE

It was 100 years to the day since the armistice was signed, bringing WW1 to an end. So at 11.00am on the 11th day, of the 11th month, a packed church observed a 2 minute silence as we remembered on those who had died in this terrible conflict. The service took place at St Bartholomew's Church and was led by Rev John Dracup. Prior to the service parade, marshalled by Peter Foden, and led by by Meltham & Meltham Mills Band took place, arriving at the church at 10.45am. Rev John Dracup and Rev John Radcliffe, received the flags and wreaths at the beginning of the service and Rev John Radcliffe gave the talk. Cllr Terry Lyons read the lessons, Simon Ball was the organist and St Bartholomew's choir were in good voice. Meltham & Meltham Mills Band accompanied some of the hymns and led the singing of the National Anthem.

As well as members of all 7 church communities, there were representatives of the scouts and guides, various community groups, Meltham Town Council and the Royal British Legion at the service.

Rev John Dracup and Rev Judy Kenworthy read out the names on the War Memorials and Rev Nancy Ndoho led the prayers and led the Act of Commitment. Following the service the wreaths were laid at the War Memorial before the parade returned to Carlile Street car park for dismissal. Refreshments were served in the Church Hall after the service.

ST MARY'S REPORT

We also held a Service of Remembrance at St Mary's Church, 2pm, to mark the centenary of the end of WW1.

Rev Judy led the service and it was good to welcome members of the Royal British Legion and also Mr Alwyn Dewhirst who spoke about members of his own family involved in the World War. Judith Moore and John Andrews read the lessons and Elizabeth played the organ. John Fox was the standard bearer and Peter Foden laid the poppy wreath on the memorial during the Act of Remembrance.

Many people brought pictures of their relatives who were involved in WW1 and these were laid on a display table on the front of the church. The music group played "Make me a channel of your peace", as this took place and Jacqueline offered prayers.

St Mary's choir and musicians are now rehearsing for some special services in December, especially the Candle Lighting Service for anyone who has lost a child on Sunday 9th December, 6.30pm and for our Carol service, 16th December at 6.00pm.

You are all most welcome to join us and may we take this opportunity to wish you all a happy and peaceful Christmas as we remember, once more, the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ.

GOOSE PIMPLES AND MOIST EYES

It all arose from a chance remark 2 to 3 years ago by Peter Murgatroyd to Andrew Johnson, almost a throw away line,"Andrew The Centenary of WW1 is not far away and you write and produce plays, why not do one based on the Meltham soldiers who lost their lives?" The result was that Andrew did just that.

He had the book written by local man Michael Nolan titled "In Search of a Memory" subtitled "The Meltham Memorial to the Dead of the First World War." With the help of this gem of a book he produced the play "Trench Ghost" featuring some of the names, families and occupations of the local lads who lost their lives in this most horrific war. The play was performed in The Parish Church Hall to good audiences on 4 evenings over the period 7th-10th November, by the Meltham Stage Players. Authentic uniforms and period dress for both the soldiers and their loved ones, shell fire and fog was created to give the play added atmosphere. The play followed the lives of 3 or 4 families with flash backs then and now and "the ghosts" of their departed sons.

Friends encouraged friends to join up, not many wanted to miss out on the big adventure. Many enrolled with that jingoistic approach and then told their wives or mothers what they had done, reassuring them that they fully expected to be back by Christmas. Young wives with toddlers were left to cope and at various times as this amazing play developed, the dreaded telegram was received.

The regime of army and trench life with orders being relayed to the men in the front line to advance, hold or pull back was well portrayed. Lads peering over the trench sand bags and ready for combat was all part of the play, which also introduced an exchange of greetings, soldier to soldier with the enemy on Christmas Day. (Never ever repeated on subsequent Christmas Days) The play included lines from some of the well known war poems read by the narrator, which blended well into the play. The tedium and camaraderie of army life was well acted as was the need to follow orders. If you grumble do this with your buddies. Few people would leave the performances without feeling the goose pimples or moist eyes. Handkerchiefs were useful.

A thoroughly professional enjoyable play performed by amateurs. Credit to all involved, players, back stage and front of house. A play that was well received and talked about in glowing terms. If you missed it you were unfortunate. It warrants a rerun at some appropriate time in the future.

HELME LADIES

Our speaker on the 9th October was John Mitchell, whose talk was titled 'Double Identity'. John spoke about people who took on the identity of others, especially in wartime to confuse spies and informers in order to protect important people. He also told us he has an identical twin brother and how they could trick people with their identity who didn't know the difference. One case, for example, was when his brother asked him to take his date out, well you can understand that relationship didn't last, John's personality was different to his brothers and therefore not successful.

It was an enjoyable and extremely amusing evening, John is a great speaker who can definitely keep you entertained.


