A Letter from your Vicar

After his cat got stuck up a tree, a Vicar mounted a rescue operation. He climbed a ladder, tied one end of a rope to the narrow trunk, and the other end to the tow bar of his car. He gently drove forward and the inevitable soon happened: the rope snapped.

No more was heard of the cat until a few weeks later. The Vicar went to visit a member of his Church, a young mum with a little boy. In her front room, lying on a rug, was the Vicar's cat. "How did you find such a lovely cat?" asked the Vicar. "You'll never believe it," replied the mum, "my little boy has been asking for a cat for ages. A few weeks ago, as I was hanging out the washing one day, I told him the only thing to do was to pray. So, we put our hands together and ask God for a cat and you'll never guess what happened next"!!!!

Prayer, coincidences, and the Holy Spirit.

In between Jesus' death and resurrection there seems only to have been despair. In between his resurrection and ascension there was joy for those that saw him and confusion for many of those who didn't. There was excitement for those who believed and struggle for those who found they couldn't. After his ascension there was pause, reflection, and anticipation. Jesus had given his disciples a task, a mission, the great commission. They were to be witnesses to every nation.

So, in response they did the same as they had been doing since Jesus' arrest, they hid in a room, afraid and confused with no idea what would come next. Oh, and they did one more thing, as they were in that room together, they prayed. It wasn't until the Holy Spirit came at Pentecost that they knew what to do and how to do it.

Today our task as the Church is the same as it was for the disciples, we are to be witnesses for Christ. Unless we pray, we will never really know what to do about this or have the ability to do it. We may say "we just don't have the resources" and that's true, just as it was for the disciples before Pentecost.

Over the years I have found that when I pray things often just happen. William Temple put it like this, "When I pray coincidences happen. And when I stop praying, the coincidences stop."

Is it a coincidence that the Churches that pray for growth are the Churches that are most likely to grow? As we look forward to celebrating the day of Pentecost later this month please pray that the Holy Spirit will fill our Churches so that we will experience a great many coincidences.

THE BOXER ON WEST NAB

You need good vision to spot it. I would not have done so but my sharp eyed grandson spotted a painted figure on a prominent rock on West Nab. It was two and a half years since I had walked to the summit and on this occasion 9 May I invited Alistair to come with me. He went at my pace, (slower than my last trek). When you walk up Calmlands Road to "the wall end" it is always a joy to bump in to people you know and have a chat for a minute or two. In addition it provides a welcome break for a breather and for my grandson to share in the glory of Royd Edge and beyond.

Having passed the familiar Cock Crowing Stone we left the road and followed the track to West Nab over peat sodden pools of water and grit-stone outcrops. I'm sure the hills get steeper (no John, it's you that's getting older!) About half way towards the top and well into the skyline was a group of bold rocks and Alistair could pick out some printing and a white painted figure. A good reason to investigate. On the front of the rock and facing Wessenden Head Road was a large figure of a boxer and in white paint below the name Rocky, which was partially obliterated by other letters. To spot this you have to walk a

We could only presume this had been painted quite a number of years ago at or about the time of the Rocky films starring Sylvester Stallone. See photo below.

If you have an opportunity and feel inclined leave the car on the road by the path up to West Nab and if necessary take some binoculars and scan the skyline for the boxer. He will be there for years to come.

We continued our walk down the road and then on the path skirting West Nab Cottage (the shooting lodge) where there is now a sturdy hardwood table and benches for public use. A circuit of two and a half hours. Near the lodge we met a man doing the full circuit Marsden back to Marsden via the Wessenden



Helme Ladies Report April 2019




