We are currently training to be Lay Pastoral Ministers. I'm sure some of you are aware of our training and we thank you for your kind interest.


We have just come to the end of our 2nd year, with only 1 year left to go, so we thought it would be of interest to share with you how we are doing.



TRADITIONAL WEDDING ANNIVERSARY GIFTS

If you attended the wonderful St Mary's Flower Festival, did you try your hand at the Wedding Anniversaries quiz? Here's a follow article from Kim Howe to help you with the ones you couldn't remember at the time.

There are the traditional and modern materials related to each wedding anniversary, usually progressing from the weakest to the strongest as the years go by, to symbolise the strengthening of the relationship.

Before the 1930's not all wedding anniversaries had a material representing the year. Only the first anniversary and milestone anniversaries such as 5th 10th, 20th, 25th, 50th and 75th had a gift suggestion. *Etiquette in Society, in Business, in Politics and at Home* by Emily Post, published in 1922, contained suggestions for these milestones. Over the years more materials have been added and the list updated and modernised.

The UK list featured in our flower arrangements is what is now considered the list to go by. (There are also traditional and modern U.S. versions which were compiled by librarians at the Chicago Public Library in 2000 and are based on the American National Retail Jeweller Association's list published in 1937.)

Buying a traditional gift for your wedding anniversary is very important, each anniversary material has its own unique meaning which represents the stage you are in your marriage The meaning may relate to you personally and provide a really great thoughtful touch to the very important task of buying gifts for your wedding anniversary.

You are welcome to 'come and see' and we promise you will be welcome though not pressured to come back again.

Our service style can be best described as varied and semi-structured with diversity and informality. The services all last about 1 hour and are followed by a cuppa and good biscuits! If you are running late still come and join us, you probably won't be the only late comer! We do understand how busy life can be.

The monthly pattern is:--

I st Sunday at 9.30: 'ONE for ALL' an informal, all age worship service. The children help run this service.

2nd Sunday at 9.30: A Service of Holy Communion and at 4.30: Five Alive. It's called Five Alive because it starts at 5.00pm but we meet at 4.30 to share Tea! Five Alive is a different, creative type of service run by a small team, which again is child friendly. Children are welcome to all of our services but 'One for All' and 'Five Alive' are the two that are especially child friendly.

3rd Sunday at 9.30: A Service of Music and Reflection. This service follows a theme with a visual audio presentation. It gives time to reflect on an aspect of our faith, in a focussed way, which is never boring.

4th Sunday at 9.30: our Second Service of Holy Communion

We are an active Church. Nearly all of our members are involved in activities beyond coming to church on Sunday. These include supporting Meltham through the **Cross Roads Centre**; **Operation Christmas Child** which last year saw us process 14,500, '**Iove in a box**' shoe boxes; **Meltham Mustard Seed**; the **Welcome Centre**; both by collecting food for the **food bank** and through the **Card Making Group** who make and sell thousands of greeting cards to support the Centre's work. We also hold an annual coffee morning to raise funds for the charity '**Crisis'** which supports the homeless.





Our thanks go to the Church congregation and to Margaret Thorley who respectively purchased and sold the various cuts of our Hog until its cost of £420 was just about covered. Our grateful thanks too to our commercial sponsors who enabled us to maximise the profit on our craft beer, cider, wine and prosecco sales. Before the day, a total of £2,035 had come in cash from our business partners while others had provided their services without charge. As per usual the actual day wasn't without its challenges. Rain overnight had left a cool, damp, overcast early morning; two beer engines which worked perfectly when being cleaned the previous day failed to work when needed; and the parade's route this year would end in a different place. In the event our worries proved unfounded for after a slow start we were suddenly inundated by thirsty and hungry merry-makers. What's more, those clouds had rolled away leaving a hot sunny day that was perfect for a barbie! And Anthony was more or less recovered to take part on the day. The result - raising a total of £5,430 to allocate to our three worthy causes – meant that the team were well pleased with their efforts.

Without our volunteers' unfailing help and welcoming faces on the day, the event could not be a success. Thanks too to our friends in the Church Hall for the use of the facilities and space. Keep abreast of any news about future Memories events.
