



She would make enquiries, sure enough we could have use of one of the rooms. So Helme Ladies have decamped to the Town Hall for their meetings on Tuesday mornings at 10.15am for the foreseeable future. Our last meeting in Helme Church will be our carol service and lunch on December 3rd.

Well, we met at the Crossroads Hub in Meltham Town Hall on November 19th and guess what? They had a boiler

malfunction. An electric heater was brought in and it warmed the room which was guite small and then the heating came on too, so we were very cosy. We sat and chattered and then finalised details for the carol service. Over tea. coffee and biscuits we decided which charities we were going to support: Alzheimers, Yorkshire Air Ambulance, Yorkshire Cancer Research and Guide Dogs for the Blind, these will receive £200 each. We heard that the boiler in church was going to be looked at to see if it could be mended, fingers crossed! After our carol service and lunch, we shall be going to Meltham Golf Club for Christmas Lunch which will be nice. It always tastes better when someone else does the cooking. Then we shall have a break until 4th Jan, when we are having a watercolour demonstration by John Mitchell followed by the New Year Feast.





Meltham Bellringers

Since the clock at St. Bartholomew's stopped and the tower was made weather proof, the bellringers of Meltham have been able to ring for services every Sunday without rainwater running down the ropes and up their sleeves. Our numbers have grown and ringers visit our practices to help us improve our ringing skills. But there are never enough ringers around to ring all the bells in the region on Sundays. Prior to the worldwide celebration of the 100th Anniversary of the Armistice in 2018, the Central Council for Church Bell Ringers decided to launch a campaign which included recruiting 1400 new ringers as a way of remembering those 1400 ringers who died during the War. In fact they recruited some 2000+ across the country. We were lucky enough to have Ben Wadsworth volunteer for this occasion and he continues to ring with us now.

We ring for service at St. Bart's at 9 a.m. and then we go over to help at Kirkheaton for their service at 10. Most of us visit other towers for additional practice time on different days of the week, quite often followed by a quick visit to a local hostelry for refreshment and generally putting the world to rights!

If anyone would care to come and see what it's all about you would be more than welcome, please contact Peter M. Where else would you get free tuition in a wonderful and rewarding pastime!




CHOIR NOTES



The Opening of the Crossroads Centre at the Old Town Hall.

On Saturday 12th October the opening of the new premises of the Crossroads Centre took place. It was a very happy event with Mrs Constance Crosland ceremoniously cutting the ribbon to officially declare that finally, after many months, the Old Town Hall would be the new venue for the Crossroads Advice and Information Centre.

In February 1996 with the support of Meltham Churches Together, the Crossroads Shop opened in Meltham. Its main aim has always been to help our community access good quality clothing, toys, bedding and household goods at very low affordable prices. They soon realised that they were able to make enough profit to give out small grants. Over the years Crossroads has given out more than £575,000 in grants.

In 1997 the need became apparent for a base to accommodate local charities and support services for the people Of Meltham and surrounding areas. In April of that year, funded by the Crossroads Shop, the Crossroads Advice Centre was opened in Lane Dyke House on Holmfirth Road. Over the years many agencies have worked with us to provide help and support for the people of Meltham and surrounding areas. Age Concern, Citizens Advice Bureau, Support to Recovery (S2R) Ridley and Hall Solicitors, United Healing Christian Ministry, the Alzheimer's Society, Work Link and many others have been involved with us.

22 years later our aims remain the same. We now provide advice and help for Debt and Benefit issues and Legal Advice, together with general advice to those who need it. The Meltham Food bank now operates from the Centre and continues to be a much needed and important resource.

Having been in our new home for over a month we have all been excited by the new challenges and opportunities that we are presented with on a daily basis. We have become more visible and some times feel we have become Meltham's tourist information point with people popping in to ask questions and wanting to look round!

People from all the churches in Meltham and those sympathetic to our aims work hard to ensure that the Centre is a warm and welcoming place for whoever calls and whatever their need.



- The orange is round like the world.
- The candle stands tall and straight and gives light in the dark like the love of God.
- The red ribbon goes all around the 'world' and is a symbol of the blood Jesus shed when he died for us. The four sticks point in all directions and symbolise North, South, East and West - they also represent the four seasons.
- The fruit and nuts (or sometimes sweets!) represent the fruits of the earth, nurtured by the sunshine and the rain.

The idea of Christingles came from a Moravian Church in Germany in 1747. The minister, John de Watteville, gave children at the service a lighted candle with a red ribbon around it. This represented Jesus being the light of the world and the final prayer of that first service was "Lord Jesus, kindle a flame in these children's hearts, that theirs like Thine become". The custom went around the world with the church.
