


Letter from your Vicar.

Firstly, I would like to thank all those who were able to turn up to our Extraordinary Parochial Church Meeting on Wednesday 19th of February. As the weather was really very poor, I was pleased to have such a good turnout. The result was that we agreed unanimously to accept our new constitution which will now be passed to the house of Bishops for final approval.

Secondly, as we are about to begin the season of Lent, I thought I should get one last bad joke out of my system.

'A man moves to a new town and goes into the local pub. He orders three pints and sits down by himself and enjoys the three drinks by taking a mouthful from each in turn until they are all gone. When he returned to the bar the landlady asked why he would drink in such a peculiar way. So he explained that he had two brothers, one lived in America and the other in Australia, and that this was his way of sharing a drink with them while they were apart.

A few months later the man asked for only two pints rather than his customary three, and this went on for several weeks. The landlady began to presume that something terrible must have happened to one of the brothers. Eventually she asked the man, he smiled and replied, "They're both fine, its just that I've given up drinking for Lent!"

Lent often seems to be about giving something up, though we often suggest that people might take up something good instead. Lent should be a period when we prepare ourselves for the coming of Jesus, and perhaps giving up all the things that we know are wrong and doing lots of good things instead would be a good way to prepare.

The problem is that we are no more capable of living a perfect life during Lent than we are at any other time of the year. That's the point of Easter and why Easter is central to the whole Christian message, that's why we call it "The Good News". Jesus, who did nothing wrong and therefore didn't deserve to be punished, died on a cross so that we who have all done something wrong can be forgiven.

And so, what ever you choose to do this Lent, giving up or taking up, I wish you well. But much more importantly, I encourage you all to hear and listen to the Good News, that no matter what we have done wrong, if we are ready to say sorry, our Lord and Saviour, Jesus, is not only ready to forgive us, but if we will let him, he is ready to help us in our lives today.

Refreshments will be served in the Sunday School, allowing time to talk if this is appropriate for you.

Over the last 6 years we have held services for bereaved parents, we have an altar cloth with the names of all the children that have been remembered at our church. These names will be presented on a large screen throughout the afternoon. You are warmly invited to add the name of your child to the altar cloth.



St. Mary's church was built by bereaved parents who wanted to bury their daughter nearby. Mary was the name of their 23 year old child who died during childbirth in 1863. Having lost a child myself I feel there is a need to support parents who have suffered the worst kind of loss. Mother's Day can be a difficult time, hopefully you will feel some comfort with happy memories and in a safe space.


Helme Ladies Report February
