Letter from your Vicar.

Is the lockdown over or has it been relaxed? There is some confusion at the moment, but either way, social distancing and considerable restrictions continue to be in place, and these are likely to continue for some time.

The last few months have been difficult for everyone, we have all struggled in different ways, and it would be wrong for us to compare how difficult we have found things. Whether we have had to deal with isolation and loneliness, increased pressures from work, or the fear of losing our jobs, things have not been easy and sadly many of these difficulties will continue for some time to come. However, I'm sure we would all wish to express our deepest sympathies to those who have lost loved ones.

As things do begin to change, I'm sure there are many questions around when things may begin to start moving in Church, and when we may be able to start having some kind of services again. The short and simple answer to this is that all of our buildings remain closed for now. This is in line with both government and national Church guidelines. As for when this might begin to change, I hope you will forgive me for not speculating, but I think that would be unhelpful. The national Church is in regular conversation with the government and our own diocese has been working on this question. I do receive regular updates that while they can be quite lengthy, they are, perhaps inevitably, not always entirely consistent. Please try to be patient, these inconsistencies are a result of the complexities of the extremely difficult and evolving situation, rather than a lack of clarity of thought or of effort.

In our own parish many thoughts are in place, but without firm guidance at a national level (or a crystal ball) it is impossible to say when or even what shape or reopening might take. I would however like to reassure you all that it is fully intended and expected, that all of our buildings will be reopening.

For now, if anyone feels that they have a genuine "need" to enter one of our buildings, they must contact me before doing so. I am required to keep a register of all building access's and ensure that they are safe. I may have to refuse you access and so I apologise for this in advance, but safety must and will come first.

I look forward to being able to see you all again as soon as it is safe for us to gather together. I pray that you will all stay safe and well, and please use the ability to meet each other for limited contact wisely and carefully.





For those of you who were able to listen to the Rev Johns Morning service on Rogation Sunday (16th May) you may, like me, have been impressed by the quality of the hymn singing. A gentle version of 'Be Still' started the service and after the Peace a rousing version of 'Great is thy faithfulness.' It reminded me as it always does of my dad, a member of St Bartholomew's church choir for 75 years and on the recording that Simon uses to share with us on a Sunday morning. 'Be still' is a new recording by the Virtual choir recorded in individual members homes and put together by Simon for us all to enjoy.

What's this got to do with Crossroads?

The Crossroads project has been running for over 25 years, the result of a vision shared by many people about the need for us to do something in our Community. Many people have been involved with it over the years from all the churches in Meltham, all with the same aim of providing opportunities to serve the community of Meltham and surrounding areas in practical ways as a witness to the love of God

As a new choir emerges and new volunteers join us at the Crossroads project we can look back with gratitude at the inspiration of all those who have gone before and those many people who are waiting in the wings to come back and take up the reins once the lockdown is eased and the shop, the Centre and the churches can reopen. We are looking forward to that day!

The Centre continues to be busy and the amount of food parcels delivered 7 days a week continues to rise, We are very grateful for the generous response from the Community who continue to make financial gifts and donations of food since Covid 19 began. A grant from the 'One Community foundation' has enabled us to buy a new chest freezer and a large larder fridge both essential for storing the food safely.

The Meltham.org Help Line

The Helpline set up with members of our Town Council, Crossroads Centre Staff and community volunteers has now been operational for over 9 weeks!

Originally based at the Crossroads Centre on Carlile Street it relocated to become operational from the homes of the Help Line staff. This was only possible because of the amazing wizardry of the techy's who created the web site, telephone, and email dedicated lines.

In no time at all Meltham folk responded to the call to register to become volunteers for the Help Line. Some 200 fantastic folk became ready to meet the needs of local folk who were labelled 'Isolated', 'Vulnerable', 'Shielded' and just 'old'!

Many of our volunteers are now 'buddies' to a Meltham resident and do not need the Help Line as they have direct contact with the volunteer who shops for them, picks up the prescription or is there for a chat.

Week 8 of the lock down has seen some volunteers return to work or their home circumstances change so the original pool has shrunk. On the other hand, many of those who needed help initially are now well supported and the number of calls to the Help Line has reduced.

Since we started our local group the NHS and Kirklees Covid19 lines have opened. Folk now have a choice of who they might ask for help.

We have heard stories of new friendships due to the Help Line. Some distressing stories from relatives living far away desperately wanting help for a loved one in Meltham. An estranged Mum wanting Easter Eggs delivering to children she would not see due to lock down. Whatever the need, those of us who man the telephone or the 'service Desk' have found it a privilege to be able to help.

Thank you, all you amazing Meltham.org volunteers you continue to rise to every challenge we present to you.

We will keep going whilst ever there is a need. Together we will beat this Virus and Meltham will become a stronger safer place to be.





A Journey In Search Of Kindness Nigel Priestly



Imagine Meltham being designated “Yorkshire’s Capital of Kindness”! You may think it already is! Can a town or city make “Kindness” central to its development?

At the end of January 2020, I went with a group of church leaders and business people to Brantford in Ontario, Canada to investigate its aspiration to be the “Kindness Capital of Canada.” We wanted to see what this means in practice. It was a whistle stop visit - we flew on Friday morning and came back overnight on Monday evening. To Canada and back in four days was a mad thing to do. But it showed me that God is alive and keeping creating and doing new things.

The initiative began in a church, Freedom House - www.freedomhouse.ca. Brantford had been the heart of production for Massey-Ferguson and other agricultural manufacturing. These closed in the 80’s with the loss of over 10,000 jobs. It went from being a prosperous city to being significantly economically depressed, with a particular impact on the downtown area. In many ways in the past Meltham has faced similar pressures with the closure of the Mills and David Brown Tractors which in its hey-day manufactured over 7,000 tractors and employed over 4,000 people.

Freedom House responded to this need by offering assistance to low income families for their basic everyday needs and employing debt advisors to help folk out of poverty. The ‘Kindness Centre’ has for many years been providing food, clothing and supplies and a ‘generous helping of hope’ to thousands of families in the City.

Freedom House has a strap line - “Ordinary people believing that kindness can transform a city”. Another is “Transformed People Transforming the City.” The church opened in a disused bar/disco in the downtown. For two years every Friday night they gave away free



hamburgers and hotdogs to whoever came past, to establish street credibility. They created Frosty Fest, a winter festival over two days that can attract over 10000 people with ice skating, pony rides, ice carving, a snow slide and other activities. This was part of the Kindness Project. This was set up, working with the municipal authorities. In the summer they were invited to organise open air cinema in a square in the centre of town. There’s even a Captain Kindness who gets invited into local schools to talk about the importance of kindness!

There was a brilliant project for youth working with other churches - www.whynotyouthcentres.com



In many ways it reminded me of Meltham, how the churches and other organisations have worked together to provide support and assistance to the many people in our Community who are often isolated and lonely. We are fortunate to have the groups who organise the luncheon club, the coffee mornings and the walking groups. There is the work of the Cross-roads Project with its Charity shop and Advice Centre. Add to this the development of the Carlile Institute which has meant that there’s a base for knit and natter, Art groups, Singing and a Ukulele group and other imaginative ventures.

The close working relationship we enjoy with the Town Council can be celebrated and built upon as we think what it means to be Meltham a town with kindness at its core.

As our services in our four churches continue to be paused Revd John Dracup is providing an online service each Sunday, which can be accessed at any time during the following week at a time to suit you. Our thanks go to him for this and also to Lay Reader Jacqueline France for hosting the zoom services each week and to all those who are taking part in them.

On Sunday 19th April Kim Howe led a Service of the Word on Zoom. Revd Judy gave the talk (over the telephone) and was relieved that everyone could hear her, even if they couldn't see her. She spoke about how Jesus dispels our doubts and fears, He walks alongside us and if necessary He will carry us through this current crisis. She also reminded us of those special words "Peace be with you". Elizabeth Pearson played the keyboard from her home to accompany three hymns, Jacqueline led the prayers and Clive Pearson read the lessons. We sang "Happy Birthday" to Evie and Gwyn and it was good to share this virtual service with 19 adults and 1 child.

The following Sunday, 26th April, Jacqueline led an Evening Service and took for her theme "GOD OF PEACE" Revd Dennis Shields read the lessons, Elizabeth played the keyboard and Kim offered the prayers. This was a quiet gentle service giving us the chance to experience God's peace in this time of worry and turmoil. It was good to welcome 16 people to worship with us.

On Sunday 3rd May Jacqueline led an All Age Service on zoom at 11.15am. 23 adults and 9 children, from across the parish, took part in this online service. There was a warming up exercise to start with and the children had a go at drawing on the screen. They were also encouraged to make suggestions of how we can help during the Coronavirus lockdown and we all sang an action song. Jacqueline spoke about how Jesus changes lives and how He is with us in our homes and wherever we are. The children had made paper models of Jesus during the previous week and we saw photographs on screen of "Jesus" with us in our homes and gardens. ([See page 33 for a copy of these](#)) Revd Dennis read the lesson, Kim led the prayers and Elizabeth provided the music. Our thanks go to Jacqueline for such a busy and thought-provoking service.

On 10th May Revd Dennis led a Holy Communion service at 11,15am. He opened the service with a prayer for VE Day and one for those who are ill from the coronavirus and those who have died. Lay Reader Hester Deacon read the lessons, Elizabeth played the keyboard and Jacqueline led the prayers. We listened to "Somewhere over the Rainbow" and Revd Dennis said we all want to find our way home and need a little bit of courage and a lot of heart to get there.

Our world is changing so much at the moment so it is good to know that even in our darkest hour we can trust God and be confident that nothing can separate us from His love.



The Church is not closed – it's now open 24/7 (well, sort of!) **...an insight into our online Parish services by Simon Ball**

Prior to Boris Johnson announcing that the country would be going into lockdown due to Covid-19, it was announced that our 4 church buildings and church hall would be closed until further notice with all services and social activities suspended until further notice. There were going to be difficult times ahead, and there was a desire to be able to continue to have services in some form which would still be familiar to our regular congregations. This required us to go on a steep learning curve over the next few weeks to find out how we could move our worship from the physical world of our church buildings to the virtual world of online worship from home, and how we could make it easily accessible for all. We started off initially with just a video recording of Rev John's sermon for Mothering Sunday, and created a YouTube channel to host it on (Meltham Parish). This was under 5 minutes long (probably the shortest he has ever done! 😊) but was viewed by 82 different people on the day. From this, we learnt that video files get very large, very quickly, and become difficult to handle and copy between devices – not to mention uploading! Believe it or not, we also learnt that Rev'd John is quite shy in front of a camera!

The following week was Passion Sunday and was originally planned as a joint Parish Communion at Helme. Rev John pre-recorded the service audio only, and some hymns were added. Fortunately, we have been recording hymns from services at St Bart's for use at Helme, so we have quite a decent selection plus the ones from the CDs that the choir recorded. This was all 'stitched together' into a static video using an app on the iPhone, and this was again posted to the YouTube channel. This got 47 views on the day, and many more over the following days. Obviously, many of our parishioners don't have the technology to tune in, but people have been encouraged to reach out to them by playing the services down the telephone to those they know (unfortunately the music doesn't transmit too well down the phone but the audio is audible).

Still on the learning curve, a way was discovered to use Powerpoint to create presentations containing pre-recorded audio including the service words and hymns and then to create videos. This enhanced the online worship somewhat and has enabled us to develop variety into the services including having others take part in the services with readings and using photos and now even short videos. The downside to this has been the time taken to put them together, and many hours spent into the early hours of Sunday morning to get the services ready. As with all things computer related, there have been many technical problems to navigate along the way, which you learn to 'work around' but these have sometimes caused delays to the service being ready for the Sunday morning.

The services usually have between 40 and 50 people viewing at the time when Rev'd John conducts them at the vicarage (usually at 10:30am - so they may be considered 'spiritually live') and then around 20 over the course of the rest of the day, with a few more in the following days. Easter Day was naturally more popular (similar to how it would be in our church buildings).




The Church is not closed – it's now open 24/7 (well, sort of!)

We have also now created an online virtual Parish Choir. The aim of this was to bring us together, even though we are apart, to allow people an opportunity to join a choir that they may not usually feel comfortable doing, and to use hymns that fit the theme of the service but for which we don't have a recording, and of course to bring some variation to the music in our services. Each week an accompaniment track is sent for them to record themselves at home singing the hymn or song. These are then emailed back and are then all been joined together using freeware Audacity software to create the effect of everyone singing together. This has seen up to 16 people from across the Parish and beyond taking part. Again, this is quite labour intensive, as all the individual recordings need to be synchronised together and then balanced. The end results however have been really pleasing and rewarding for those who agreed to take part. We're getting a little more ambitious as we go along, and recently learnt and recorded a new song, and are now trying out 4 part harmony. Listen out for them in the services.

So, people can now join our services any time of day or night, not just on a Sunday morning. Please continue to encourage others to join in the worship together online. You never will be late for church as you can worship at a time and place to suit you.....until we meet again.




