

Letter from the Vicar's Wife

(because John is swamped with Easter preparations)


As I prepare to put together this month's magazine, the world is starting to reflect on the events of the last twelve months and more. We have had the need to be distant from others while still trying to hold onto what we can to help keep us together via many phone and video calls. It has been said that people are not missing the material things in life but the interaction of a friendly face or a simple hug from another. It started with empty supermarket shelves and as we start to see the end in sight, it finishes with empty places at a family table.

However within all of this, many families feel closer than ever, some parents have spent more time at home with the children than they would have before. Families and friends have talked more often. I know from personal experience, I have spoken with my wider family "via Zoom" on a much more frequent basis, as we tried to keep our parents from feeling disconnected. We have been full of love and showing people how much we care. Friendships have found new ways of 'catching up' whether it be sitting freezing in a park hugging the life out of a cuppa or sat with a phone in one hand and something cold in the other.

During this time of Easter this got me thinking about Jesus' life. The Easter story starts with him 'self isolating' in the middle of the desert for 40 days having to be 'tested', not for Covid 19 obviously, but for his loyalty and teachings. Then on what we now know as 'Maundy Thursday' the evening before Good Friday, it all starts with Judas' empty place at a table. He gets Jesus arrested and tortured, the next day Jesus is convicted of prejudice and lies. Jesus doesn't get imprisoned, he is given a death sentence and executed the same day. Once dead he is laid in a tomb. However it doesn't stop there, three days later Jesus rises from the dead and leaves behind an empty tomb!

Why? <u>Because He loves YOU!</u> The real you, not the one you put up in front of social media or the one you try to portray to others, the REAL deep down YOU.

Jesus has been through loneliness, isolation and grief. He understands what it feels like to have an empty place at his family table, He is waiting for <u>you</u> to fill it.

Real Love



The 'Real Love' project started from Nigel Priestley hearing about it happening in Wakefield. Discussions took place and it was decided to do something similar in Meltham.

The aim is twofold. The first is for school staff and children at all the schools in Meltham and staff and residents in Meltham's care homes to receive a felt heart and a card with a message. We want to thank the carers for caring – whether parents or care staff and to thank the teachers for their hard work. The second aim is that we want them to know the Real Love Story of Easter – Jesus loves us without limits. The children and the residents pass on the heart to someone who has cared for them. Hearts are also being included in Food Bank Easter parcels.

When the numbers were added up, we realised that we needed 1,000 hearts! We needn't have worried. The response was amazing and the enthusiasm was fantastic. Packs of materials were made up and delivered.



Soon lots of volunteers, some from the churches and some not, were busy sewing the felt hearts designed by Lucy Whiteley. It was great to see all the chat and support in the Meltham Churches at Home WhatsApp group. Our only male volunteer had a bit of a problem with his first heart!



But he improved with practice.



Another idea which came from the discussions was to create a cairn of pebbles at each end of the Greenway for walkers to collect one and take it home. It can be kept by them or given away.

Andy Pearson bought and washed the pebbles and once again there was a number of enthusiastic people ready to demonstrate their creative skills. The hen is a whole other story!) The 'Real Love' project has been a real team effort.



Over the Easter weekend, each church in the Parish will be sharing the real love story of Easter, not only through the services but also through their creativity outdoors. Each church will be decorating a tree and using a large cross to remind us of the love of God.

From Good Friday (April 2nd) to Easter Sunday (April 4th) why not take a walk and look at what has been done?





service we were invited to plant these seeds as a symbol and a reminder of growing grace, kindness and love.


