

Letter from your Vicar.

In my view, vaccinations are a wonderful thing and something for which we should all thank both God and all those involved. However, they do seem to have turned the pandemic sort of upside down. This disease is clearly ageist, and so for the most part the younger part of society has been asked to protect the older. Now, thanks to the wonder of the vaccine it seems that some of the younger people may be more vulnerable than some of the older. This is quite confusing.

Many things about the last year have been difficult to comprehend and many things still cause me to feel confused. I have not seen my parents in person since September. They are both vulnerable and so I have had to stay away to protect them but, it does feel a bit like "to protect them I've had to neglect them". On 17th May, if the governments road map remains the same, I will finally be allowed into their home. This would seem to be our country finally returning to something a bit more "normal".

I'm sure that everyone is hoping that this is true and that we will not see any substantial setbacks. In fact, I suspect that many who would not normally join me in Church would be willing to join me in praying for that.

The last year has seen people showing compassion, generosity, and kindness in ways that have been surprising to many. Faced with the challenges of lockdowns, we have shown that we are a caring nation.

Now we are faced with another challenge, perhaps even a greater challenge. How do we move forward? There will be those who are eager and those who are hesitant, some are frustrated, others are nervous or afraid, and some are exhausted.

The Bible encourages us to care for one another in bad times and when things are better. We are to be patient, to bear with each other. How we cared for one another over the last year when things were bad was important, but I think that how we care for one another over the next year as things improve (we pray) will be just as important and may even have a more lasting effect.

Our aim in the foodbank is to not only provide food but to demonstrate to our clients that they are valued and cared for when so often, being in need produces a sense of isolation and loneliness. We ask you to continue to hold the foodbank and its users in your prayers.

During March and April our demand has continued to be very high, although the number of food parcels has not increased, we are seeing the number of Families compared to single people increase. Therefore, the amount of food being given out has increased significantly.

We continue to be in need of food donation. Currently we have high stocks of Pasta and rice, but we are in need of everything else. Including cleaning, personal care, and pet food products.

As usual I sincerely thank our volunteers and supporters.

A SMILE FROM A PRINCE

This afternoon I sat alone in front of St Barts Church and listened to Peter tolling the tenor bell, half muffled for half an hour, followed by one minute's silence for the funeral of HRH Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh. It was an eerie experience as for each toll of the bell, there was a muffled echo, which gave me goosebumps and brought back my own fond memories of Prince Philip.

He gave up his life in the military when his beloved wife, Princess Elizabeth, quite unexpectedly, became next in line to the throne, even though he had grown up in Greek royalty rather than British. I think I admired him most for the way he always spoke his mind, said what he first thought and often landed himself in deep water. (Much like me, I suppose).

My special, personal memory of him was during the Royal Tour for the Silver Jubilee in 1977 when they visited 'the north'. They were travelling from Liverpool to Salford along the East Lancashire Road, but cut through the small village of Boothstown, where we lived at the time. I ran a playgroup, but as soon as we finished the morning session, I took my daughter Alison, aged 4 yrs and her friend Stuart, aged 2 yrs down the road to where the royal vehicles were due to pass.

We waited and waited and then there was a commotion higher up the road and the first car appeared around the corner of the junction where we were standing. I picked Alison up in my left arm and Stuart in my right, balancing my 35mm camera between them, just as the beautiful black limo with the glass back came alongside. The Queen was on the farside of the rear of the car, waving to the crowds across the road from us, but Prince Philip was facing our side and as the car drew level, he looked straight at us, waved to the kids and gave us a beautiful smile. He was only about 6 feet from us (sorry kids, this is old money but it is about 2 metres). He probably thought 'Look at that poor woman with 2 such young children', but it was amazing even though the kids did not realise what all the fuss was about.

I did manage to snap off a few photos, but it was not easy with a child on each arm so I could not wait to get the 35mm film developed (this was the olden day, kids, no mobile phones then, no instant photos). When the day came for me to collect my printed photos from the chemist shop, I was told the manager wanted a word. He wanted to know how I had managed to take such a beautiful photograph of Prince Philip from so close. I was thrilled and cherished that photo for many years, but unfortunately it got lost with all our house moves. However this afternoon, while listening to the tolling of the bell, I closed my eyes and the picture came back into my memory as clear as it had been back in 1977 when I got a smile from a Prince.

We were so lucky to have had HRH Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh to love and support our Queen Elizabeth for so long until the day he died. May he rest in peace.

So much wonderful music written over the centuries has been inspired by words from the Bible, Hymns, Anthems, Oratorios etc, and selecting one has been particularly difficult for many reasons.

However one which has always been an inspiration and meant a lot to me has been "I was glad" by Hubert Parry, just to start singing with those three words is marvellous. Traditionally sung at the coronation of a British Monarch, the text consists of verses from Psalm 122.....".I was glad when they said unto me, We will go into the house of the Lord, our feet shall stand in thy gates oh Jerusalem". The anthem begins with the orchestral or organ introduction, building up to an ever increasing crescendo before the choir enters singing three beautiful unaccompanied chords with such fervour and meaning in the words, it is quite overwhelming.

Hubert Parry wrote some wonderfully stirring music, also deeply moving music to passages from scripture; Dear Lord and Father of Mankind - and Jerusalem written in 1916, to brace the spirit of the nation, and chosen by the WI are two songs people know and love.

We hope that you all had a nice Easter and are ready to embrace a bit more freedom as lock-down begins to ease. May Jesus our Saviour and our friend light our way and keep us safe as we take our first tentative steps back into some sort of normality.





St Mary's Church - a surprising discovery

With permission through a faculty from the Church of England, due to the poor state of repair, the plaster was removed from the east end of St Mary's, Wilshaw. On each side of the window texts were discovered. The left side being in a better but fragile condition compare to the right side. Below is an extract of the beautiful description that was featured in the Huddersfield Chronicle on 15th October 1864 on the reopening of the Church after the decoration was completed.

...The interior of the church is magnificently decorated, the ceiling and the east end being the most striking and elaborate. The ceiling is profusely decorated with ornaments of good design in gold and ultramarine, on a rich cream-colour ground. The effect thus produced is most pleasing, and for richness and neatness its equal is rarely to be seen. Between the wall-plate and the ceiling is an ornamental border richly illuminated in gold vermillion. The wood work is stained oak, with inlaid patris painted upon it, which, so far as concerns the roof, makes it complete. The east end, over the chancel arch, is a most beautiful design, and gorgeously decorated, the whole surface being completely covered with texts and ornaments. On the top part, under the wall plate, painted in vermillion, with blue capitals, are the words, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, goodwill towards men." Next to the arch, in blue letters and vermillion capitals are the words, "Holy, holy, holy Lord God Almighty, Alleluiah, Amen." The ornamental being chiefly painted in stone-...All the texts are in Roman capitals to correspond colours, marine and gold... with the building, which is Romanesque. The chancel ceiling is exceedingly rich and in good harmony with the stained glass windows, the ground is a rich

ultramarine blue, emblazoned with ornaments in gold and scarlet; the walls on the north and south sides are diapered and the east end, on each side of the large stained glass window, are tablets containing the Ten Commandments, Apostles' Creed, and Lord's Prayer, with illuminated capitals on a gilded ground. Round the stone work over the window are the words, "The Lamb of God which taketh away the sin of the world." and above this under the wall plate close to the roof are the words,

"Glory, honour, power, be unto the Lamb." The whole of the decoration has been executed by Mr. George Brighouse, decorator, John Williamstreet, Huddersfield, under the superintendence of Mr Kirk, architect.
