#### **Letter from your Vicar.**

After two years of covid and As we approach another annual General meeting (APCM to be held on the 27<sup>th</sup> of April at 7:00pm in St Bartholomew's Church) I think that, in one way or another, we are all asking the same question:

#### Are we getting back to normal yet?

This last year has certainly not been back to normal. Restrictions have varied through the year not least with the omicron variant over Christmas but, many things have begun to be "more normal".

In April last year the APCM was able to go ahead which was an improvement after the 2020 APCM had been delayed from April to October. We were still in the early days of the vaccine rollout and still



had many covid related restrictions. Therefore, I felt that it was a very great positive that we were able to fill most of the spaces on PCC and on all four of the Church Steering Groups.

During the last year we have been able to restart some activities and hold most of the events that we would normally aim to. In June there was a very successful Party in the Park which we were able to support, and the civic service went ahead in September. After discussions with the British Legion and members of the council it was decided that our Parish Remembrance Day service should be held outside again. This was for covid related reasons but unlike 2020 we didn't need to apply for a permit from Kirklees.

As Christmas came along so did omicron which resulted in the government sending out some very mixed messages regarding socialising. This did influence the number of people attending some events, but overall things were much better attended than in 2020.

#### Many thankyou's

I am deeply grateful to everyone who has helped to make this year a success. Especially our Church Wardens, PCC and steering group members who have all worked hard through what have often been challenging circumstances. I thank God for all those who have helped to keep our finances in order, for those who give regularly, for those who have left us legacies, and for those who have kept our accounts. And finally thank you to all who are involved in leading and enabling our worship and many parish activities.

Unfortunately, naming everyone involved would make this letter incredibly long but, please be assured that your contribution is greatly valued by myself and by God.



#### **Real Love at Easter**



Last year we had exciting times at Easter. We gave away felt hearts, cards and painted stones to remember what Real Love is - that Jesus loves without limits.

#### **UKRAINE APPEAL....IT WAS AN AMAZING 4 DAYS!**

It all began on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> March when Judith & Paul Powell, Mike Still, Grace Dronsfield and myself got together and decided that we must do something to help the displaced Ukrainians who were having to leave their homes and flee across the borders into neighbouring safe Countries in order to escape the bombing and fighting. This was a humanitarian crisis and there was an urgent need for basic supplies.

The local schools in Meltham were all contacted and emails were sent out by the staff to all the parents on the school's mailing lists appealing for donations. From the morning of Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> March, donations began to appear at the three Meltham Drop-Off Points, Morrisons, the Co-op and the Crossroads Shop. We also received donations from Aldi, in Thongsbridge, who had set up an appeal for their customers to donate items but didn't know what to do with the huge quantity donated. Local businesses in Holmfirth also became involved with WH Brown (Estate Agents) acting as a Drop-Off Point.

Because we had advertised the Drop-Off Points, on social media, the appeal took off at a stratospheric level and our "warehouse" at

St James Church was flooded with a huge quantity of much-needed supplies, on a

daily basis, that would provide the refugees with the basics that they so desperately needed during such a turbulent time in their lives.

They had hurriedly left their homes with just what they could carry and this was minimal. They suffered so much and faced a difficult journey to escape the bombing and cross over the border into safe and welcoming Countries where they were received with open arms and an abundance of love. Women and young children who had left husbands, fathers and older sons behind in Ukraine to defend their homeland from the aggression of the Russian invasion not

knowing whether they would ever see their loved ones again and be reunited as a family.

The "warehouse" had become a hive of activity as lots of volunteers came along each afternoon to sort out and group the donations into cardboard boxes. It was a wonderful sight to see and we were continually

amazed at the generosity of so many people in Meltham and the surrounding area.

On Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> March, as donations continued to flood in, we busily processed them in readiness for the arrival of the van, provided by

TayTrans, that was expected in the late afternoon. On its arrival, with careful loading, we were amazed at the huge number of filled boxes that were able to fit into the van. As it was driven away from outside St James, bound for the T4U Head Office in Wrexham the following morning, it was an emotional time for everyone who had been



involved during the four days and especially for the five of us who had met together just 3 days earlier and who had felt compelled to do something and enable the local community to come onboard and "make it happen".

And it certainly happened...my goodness, didn't it just happen! All the hard work became so worthwhile because we knew just how much the content of the boxes from Meltham would help our Ukrainian friends.

It is wonderful to realise how people across Europe have been so moved by what they see on their TV screens and respond in such a humanitarian way.

It is true to say that, as the people of Ukraine weep, then people here in the UK, in mainland Europe and across the World also weep.

As Jesus wept over Jerusalem (Luke 19:41), our Lord must also be weeping over Ukraine at this sad time.

#### **UKRAINE APPEAL ...An Update**

On 1st March, a prayer vigil was held in St Bart's church for the situation in Ukraine. During that time a text donation number was set up to send funds directly to the Meltham Shoe Box partners, Teams4U, who already have links in the countries the refugees are fleeing to like Poland and Moldova etc (where the Christmas Shoe Box appeal went to this year). This money would be used to buy food and medicine parcels. Through this text service £277.59 was given. Following that as the need grew, we were able to send the filled van to the T4U warehouse to join others where it would be taken collectively to the areas in need.



Further more, due to the unfortunate cancellation of a coffee morning on Saturday 19th March, the Parish used the free spot and pulled together, yet again at short notice, a coffee morning where 100% of the money raised would be given to T4U to specifically help the refugees. A cake stall, tombola, a soft toy stall where provided and even small badges of the Ukrainian flag were sold to show

The money raised came to £672.10

our solidarity with the people of Ukraine.

Everyone is most welcome to attend any of the groups, even if you haven't been to any before.








#### **BELL HOUSE CARE HOME**





"And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus". (Philippians 4:19)

With the situation in Ukraine as I write this, I felt challenged to reflect on the way God has met our challenges. Inevitably this is a more personal article which I hope readers will find helpful. I have quoted the verse of confidence in our Gods provision previously. Before the pandemic started, we were supplying and supporting about 20 clients a month. Throughout the challenges of the



Pandemic God did not fail us. As we came out of the pandemic it became clear the challenges were, if anything, becoming greater. Currently we continue to support over 100 families per month.

We do not know what the future holds, it seems certain now that energy prices, and inflation will continue to soar. Additionally, as a community it is likely we may well be asked to help Ukrainian refugees. The Foodbank was able, from our limited surplus stock, to send a large quantity of Pasta to Ukraine as part of the incredible community effort with our partners Teams4U, to send a large Van loaded with needed supplies on the borders in just 3 days. Foodbank volunteers again stepping up to help collect, sort, and load the donations.

We are extremely fortunate as a foodbank to be subsidised each moth from the crossroads project, and as a Christian based organisation, to have the support of our trustee's to be generous reflecting the heart of God. The direct donations from everyone are very valued both food and money but have for some time been outstripped by demand. We have also many examples of large direct donations arriving unexpectedly just when we needed them.

Some may ask the question, "How can you say its God that provides your needs? Its clearly the people of Meltham through the crossroads project". I believe it is God that inspires our human hearts, it is part of us being created in his image,

"We love because he first loved us". John 4:19.

We certainly know it has nothing to do with the devil, we see the evil inspired by him graphically displayed on our TV screens. It is certainly beyond my training and ability to be able to explain or understand, the details of the spiritual warfare that is behind such evil. In the end I rest on Pauls explanation in his letter to the Ephesians 6:12 For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places.

My personal faith journey has led me to strongly identify with the saying, "The older I get the less I understand but the more I believe". As we move forward into a very humanly uncertain future, I am certain although there are many things I can't explain. I have confidence that God is in control, his character and dependability never changes, and his love for humanity never faulters.

The challenge for us is to reflect Gods love, "to be His ambassadors". This is one of the core principals which guides the development and running of the foodbank.


