

Letter from your Vicar

'I declare before you all that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service' (21st birthday broadcast, 21 April 1947).

Many of us have been shocked and saddened by the recent death of Queen Elizabeth II. For most of us, we've never known another monarch and we're used to the stability of her presence.

Much has been said about her humility, servant heart and commitment to duty over the 70 years of her reign. The secret of the Queen's consistency of character and service was her Christian Faith: 'To many of us our beliefs are of fundamental importance. For me the teachings of Christ and my own personal accountability before God provide a framework in which I try to lead my life. I, like so many of you, have drawn great comfort in difficult times from Christ's words and example' (2002). It is clear that she drew strength from her faith, seeking to live according to the teachings of the Bible.

However, the Queen recognised her need for forgiveness, which she found through her personal relationship with Jesus Christ: 'Although we are capable of great acts of kindness, history teaches us that we sometimes need saving from ourselves from our recklessness or our greed. God sent into the world a unique person, neither a philosopher nor a general (important though they are), but a Saviour, with the power to forgive.' (2011).

We can truly give thanks for the Queen's commitment to serving God and the nation throughout her life. She has been a great example of what Paul says about Christian living: *And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus.* (Colossians 3:17). Let us follow her example!

During the period of mourning there were many examples of service and generous self-giving which enabled us to mark her late Majesty's passing in an appropriate manner. I would like to thank all those involved including our mayor and town council, the Lord lieutenants office who sent two deputies, Meltham and Meltham Mills band, St Bartholomew's choir, our uniformed organisations, Swooshed who provided us with a big screen to watch the funeral on. I'd also like to thank everyone who attended the events and signed the book of condolences. None of these things would have been a success without your engagement.

Well done Meltham, I believe our community marked this historic moment well, with dignity and respect and with the help of all those involved a touch of Meltham class too.

Meltham Food Bank

August's been a quieter month, as it's still the holiday season. No bad thing, as myself and Anne are still finding our feet with our new roles, and the same can be said for the new Steering Group members, Phil and Jenny. I'm slowly but surely becoming aware of how much the sorely-missed Debbie Still did behind the scenes. As Joni Mitchell said " You don't know what you've got till it's gone". Fortunately, we're also welcoming three new

volunteers to our merry band.

The coming autumn will be a test for all of us when the energy price rise kicks in, and "Heating or eating" is fast becoming an unwelcome *leitmotif of the times. We're acutely aware of the need to take a holistic approach to our clients, so we're delighted that Ziona Last will be helping our Debt and Benefit Adviser Chris Smith. Ziona has been released by her employer Richmond Fellowship for a few hours a fortnight, and she has a wealth of experience in getting vulnerable people back into meaningful employment. Her background is in mental health support, so as well as assessing clients' needs and eligibility, she'll be able to signpost clients to a range of services. Crossroads don't have the resources to support clients ad infinitum, and dependency helps no-one in the long term.*

In recent months, our outgoings have far exceeded our income, and this isn't a good state of affairs. We feel secure in the knowledge that The Crossroads Project will always be there for us, but we don't wish to treat them like some kind of magic money tree. Our volunteers are champing at the bit when it comes to fundraising, so we'll be back outside Morrison's on October 8th between 10am and 1pm, resplendent in our logoed-up T-shirts! We ask for much needed items from shoppers, and they give freely. Please turn up on the day to support us.

It's been a sombre time, with the sad passing of Queen Elizabeth, after a long life of dedicated service. However, we welcome the accession of King Charles III, and have every confidence in his abilities. He's his own man, and he'll do things his own way, with much aplomb.

And though the last lights off the black West went -

Oh, morning, at the brown brink eastward springs- Because the Holy Ghost over the World broods with warm breast and with ah! bright wings.



"THE WORLD HAS CHANGED" BISHOP NICK'S PRAYERFUL WORDS ON THE DEATH OF THE QUEEN



Following the sad news of the death of Her Late Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II, the Rt Revd Nick Baines offers these words of sombre reflection:

"Today the world has changed. The death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, who has served for over seven decades. We see the end of an era. This will have an impact not only in this country, but also in the Commonwealth and beyond, across the globe where she has been respected, indeed revered, for her commitment to duty and service over such a long time.

Since she has been the sovereign, the world has changed

considerably, and she has managed to be rooted, particularly in her Christian commitment throughout those years. A mark, a sign of stability, of solidity, of confidence in a rapidly changing world.

But today we pray not only for the rest of her soul, but also for those she leaves behind, for her family who know her not just as the Queen, but as someone they loved deeply as a mother, grandmother, great grandmother.

We pray for the nation at a time of real and symbolic change with all the fragilities of the world around us. We pray for the Commonwealth and the wider global community at a time of conflict and uncertainty. We pray that what we learn from the Queen's long life and long commitment may be something that we take into the future.

So we pray for ourselves. We pray for the new sovereign. But, at this point, we thank God for Her Majesty the Queen and commend her to the God of mercy and love whom she has served for so long."

A little prayer for those of us who are living in similar circumstances.


